9.2 District Update by the Superintendent

The Superintendent reported on the following:

- Superintendent Bennett introduced Kirk Skorpanich, Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources, to present the following RAVE Awards:
 - Heaven Boone is a science teacher at Paloma Valley High School. Mrs. Boone is engaging, supports all students, and uses real-life connections to engage students. Mrs. Blied recently walked by Mrs. Boone's classroom and saw students dropping blood drops, measuring the

- blood, and identifying the different splatter distances would cause. The students were eager to learn, which is a testament to her enthusiasm to teach.
- Frank Puebla, JROTC teacher at Paloma Valley High School. Mst. Sergeant Puebla could go make millions being a motivational speaker. When he speaks, everyone in the room listens. Day in and day out, he guides the Paloma cadets to be the best they can be. He can often still be found on campus in the evening and on the weekends. If it was possible, every student would go through a year with him at the helm, and Paloma would have the most motivated students in the state.
 - Marlene Lee Quay-Scott, Paraeducator - Special Circumstance at Pathways for Adult Life Skills. Mrs. Lee Quay-Scott is an invaluable part of the Floater Paraeducator Team because of her reliability and dependability. She is able to work with our most impacted students with patience, dignity, care, and grace. Mrs. Lee Quay-Scott has quickly become the go to paraeducator for students with medical needs because of her calm and caring demeanor. We are proud to have Mrs. Lee Quay-Scott on our team!
 - Gentri Kusick, Teacher at Pathways for Adult Life Skills. Mrs. Kusick is one of the remarkable teachers at PALS. She has created a learning environment that has transformed the lives of some of our most impacted students in her two years with us. Mrs. Kusick's organization and follow through is to be commended. She is funny, energetic, and cares deeply for the growth of each of her students. Mrs. Kusick is highly collaborative and has helped to create a warm and welcoming space for all. Mrs. Kusick is a force to be reckoned with, and we could not imagine her not being part of the team.
 - Rachel Post, Teacher at Pathways for Adult Life Skills. Mrs. Post has served as a paraeducator and teacher for the Perris Union High School District for 17 years. We are excited for Mrs. Post as she is embarking on her retirement journey this year, but it will be a major loss to PALS. Mrs. Post sees the potential in all the students she serves, inspiring them to achieve their academic, social, and functional goals. 9.5 CSEA President Helen Stimach

CSEA President Helen Stimach shared the following statement:

"Good Evening, President Garcia. Members of the Board, Superintendent Mr. Bennett, and Cabinet. My name is Helen Stimach, and I became the president of the nearly 500 classified members of chapter 469 on February 22nd after Nathaniel Nash stepped down to begin a new chapter of his life out of state. It has been an extremely busy time this past month, assuming the new duties of President. I am grateful to my director, Dr. Casaundra McNair, as well as Maribel and Kirk, for allowing me the flexibility to get comfortable again in that role, whether it was on the negotiation team, in CRC, or even in problem-solving sessions. We have a lot to get accomplished in a few short months before the school year ends. We are working on numerous MOUs and preparing sunshine articles for re-openers, as well as keeping our members informed of all the peaks and valleys that are foreshadowing the future of this District financially. The biggest struggle is in educating our members to understand the processes, procedures and reasons regarding the difficult decisions that the Board and District administration make. With new members on our negotiation team this year, I am pleased to say that the District took the time to help our new members go through the IBB (Interest Based Bargaining) process. We met on the 25th of January for a full day of training. We are grateful to Mr. Skorpanich for working so diligently on this process and feel confident that our relationship with the District will continue to be one of mutual understanding and respect. Just two short weeks ago, I stood before you personally advocating for saving jobs and programs. Although I did not agree with the Board's findings, I respect you all for having to make these tough decisions. Moving forward as President of Chapter 469, I envision that we will come together to address any future issues that affect all classified employees in an appropriate forum. As the economy continues to weigh on our minds and our paychecks we understand that financially the future picture

is bleak. However, I have not forgotten the last time I was president, and the District wanted to lay off some of our nutrition workers. A few of you were here then and stepped in to support our position. We don't want to go down that road again with any classified positions, and we will work closely with the district to ensure that we are not put into a position that requires board intervention. Finally, my intention is to represent ALL members of Chapter 469 at Perris Union and will strive to be transparent, honest, and forthright. I take this position seriously and will serve with integrity and veracity. I'm looking forward to a continued collaborative relationship and welcome the challenges ahead as opportunities for us all. Thank you."

9.6 Comments by the Board of Trustees

Trustee Nelissen attended Liberty's Open House last week and mentioned he was pleased to see the incoming eighth graders get a chance to see what they're interested in, and watching them get connected to different clubs. He plans to attend the Addams Family performance at Perris High School on Friday night with his family.

Trustee Vallejo also attended a few open houses stating they were great. She is also planning to attend the Addams Family play on Friday. She stated that the District just went through a pretty tough time these past few weeks, but she wants to let all the staff members know that despite rumors, the Board is here to serve them. Ms. Vallejo also acknowledged that it is a bit chaotic due to a new superintendent coming in. However, she reaffirmed that the Board wants the best and that the next person will be just as great as Mr. Bennett. Trustee Vallejo assured everyone that the Board will always be united when making decisions on what's best for all students and staff.

Trustee Stafford stated that he visited Heritage High School, and it was nice to see how great the school is looking. He stated that things are looking up and that the Board is working hard for everyone. He reiterated that decisions are sometimes difficult, but the Board thinks them through and supports staff and students. He encouraged the schools to keep working on attendance, as it is probably one of the most important things.

Trustee Campos stated that has not been able to visit schools. However, he will be off next week and will contact some of the sites he would like to visit to see what's happening and how the Board can support them.

Trustee Garcia stated that the Board cares and listens to what staff says. Sometimes, the Board doesn't make decisions in one person's favor per se or opinion, but they do their best to their ability. He shared that he truly values everyone and knows how important each and everybody's role is in the District. Trustee Garcia asked if the District could create an appeal process for certificated and classified employees if they wanted to appeal to the School Board as part of their discipline process. He would like that to be an action item for next month, if possible. Trustee Garcia received consensus from the other board members to place that on the agenda.
