

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING Between

## PERRIS UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT And

#### COMMUNITY ACTION PARTNERSHIP OF RIVERSIDE COUNTY

This Memorandum of Understanding is made and entered into between Perris Union High School District (School) and Community Action Partnership of Riverside County (Community Action).

#### I. PURPOSE:

To provide 10 hours of Peer Mediation Training to schools throughout the County of Riverside in order to help reduce student conflict and provide students with problem solving, communication, listening and leadership skills.

#### II. TERM:

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) shall be in effect from February 16, 2023 to June 30, 2023. This MOU shall be renewed annually. This MOU can be terminated by either party upon written notification to the other party.

#### III. RESPONSIBILITIES:

- A. School Responsibilities:
  - 1. Assign a point of contact who will coordinate the Peer Mediation Training with Community Action.
  - 2. Recruit a minimum of 20-25 students. Students should reflect school's diversity and have a strong desire to build leadership skills and help others.
  - 3. Keep track of mediation sessions conducted by the Peer Mediators.
  - 4. Submit monthly records by the 5<sup>th</sup> of each month following the training (see attached).
  - 5. Submit end of the year Program Evaluation by June 30<sup>th</sup> (see attached).
  - 6. Communicate with Community Action for technical support as needed.
  - 7. Share impact stories/photos.

#### B. Community Action Responsibilities:

- 1. Meet with school representatives to review and explore ways of implementing the program.
- 2. Coordinate and provide 10 hours of Peer Mediation training
- 3. Provide technical assistance throughout the year to enhance the program.
- 4. Provide material (curriculum, activities, etc.).
- 5. Provide incentives for students after completion of training (t-shirts, buttons, and certificates).
- 6. Provide conflict resolution workshops for school personnel and parents.
- 7. Provide an annual Volunteer Recognition Luncheon for staff and students to attend.
