The Superintendent reported on the following:

- Superintendent Bennett announced that Paloma Valley High School senior, Ryan Shubert, was accepted to the Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland.
- The BEST Awards were recently held on April 8th at the Riverside Convention Center. A number of PUHSD employees were recognized for their outstanding work with dual language students. Also, a California Military Institute senior was awarded a \$2,000 scholarship for an essay that he wrote.
- Superintendent Bennett and Trustee Nelissen attended the RCOE Student Academic Awards Recognition dinner at the Riverside Convention Center on April 11th. A Paloma Valley High School senior received a scholarship award that evening as well.

9.4 PSEA President Jason Miller

PSEA President Jason Miller shared the following statements:

- "The breakfast was much appreciated. Lots of food, grace, and flexibility towards students have been the mantra for almost the entire pandemic. This needs to be extended to teachers and employees as well. Teacher burnout is a real thing. This year seems like the toughest year for teaching ever, with teachers telling me that many times. There are more resignations, more employee absences, more stress for teachers, and more student behavioral problems than we have seen for a long time. It has been a rocky transition back into the classroom. I hope that there is some balance brought back to the world within the next few years. But teachers are burning the candle at both ends through no fault of the District, it is happening everywhere. Teachers are getting second jobs, trying to balance the rigors of the classroom with families, high inflation, and high gas prices. While spending many hours creating curriculum or grading, many teachers are teaching classes they have never taught before or have more preps than they have had in the past, also swelling class sizes. With all due respect, the District has been conscious of this and offered quite a bit of social-emotional support. Thank you, Ed. Services from employees and our members. Thank you for this. So when you see our staff at different sites, please thank them for holding the line for all of us and fighting the fire, fighting the good fight against ignorance and illiteracy. Thank you."

9.6 Comments by the Board of Trustees

Trustee Freeman shared that he attended the National School Boards Association Conference in San Diego. It was a little bit different than it had in the past, but many things changed over the last few years. He did enjoy the conference. This morning, he attended the Student of the Month breakfast at Sizzler and was introduced to four very brilliant students.

Trustee Vallejo attended the production of the High School Musical at Perris High School last month. She also attended the NSBA conference. She stated it was very insightful and nice to meet other school board members

from different states. Lastly, she thanked Mr. Miller for letting the Board know how teachers are doing.

Trustee Stafford stated that he appreciates all staff in the District. He also attended the NSBA conference and enjoyed the speakers. He also attended a presentation at Perris Lake High School regarding the use of fentanyl, and it was very emotional for students and staff. He encouraged other sites to offer the same informational presentation to their staff and students so that more people are aware of how dangerous fentanyl is. Lastly, he shared his worry about the staff's mental health and asked that everyone be kind to each other during these stressful times.

Trustee Nelissen echoed that the teachers and staff are valued and recommended that staff take advantage of the mental health services that the District offers, if necessary. He attended the RCOE Student Academic Awards Recognition dinner at the Riverside Convention Center and had the opportunity to meet some of the District's fabulous students.
