#### 9.2 District Update by the Superintendent

The Superintendent reported on the following:

- Superintendent Bennett attended CMI's Pass In Review this morning for the Change in Command Ceremony.
- The District's Employee Recognition was held on May 10th. Mr. Bennett thanked Trustees Nelissen and Vallejo for attending the event.
- Sergio Salcedo, a history teacher at Perris High School, will receive the 2022 61st Assembly District Teacher of the Year Award from Assemblyman Jose Medina. The ceremony will take place on June 4, 2022, in Riverside.
- Senior Award Nights are are taking place at the high schools during the next two weeks. Graduations and promotions will be held the week of June 6, 2022.

- Classified Employees Appreciation week is this week. After two years away, the administrators joined CSEA in their ACE program (Appreciating Classified Employees). Seventeen administrators shadowed classified staff. Superintendent Bennett shared that he shadowed John Phillips, the lead campus supervisor at Liberty High School.

# 9.4 CSEA President Josh Rushing

Hector Gonzalez, Director of Facilities, was at Heritage High School doing custodial work and getting his hands dirty. Mr. Bennett was at Liberty High School and rocked the campus supervisor job. He thanked everyone for everything.

# 9.5 PSEA President Jason Miller

PSEA President Jason Miller shared the following statements:

• "A scientist is not a person who gives the right answers; they are the ones who ask the right questions. Modified from a quote from Claude Levi-Strauss, I would like to highlight a set of teachers near and dear to my heart since I am one. Of course, I'm talking about the science teachers and how often I brag about back-to-school nights and open houses to parents about the programs and science our District offers and has promoted throughout the years. We have science programs and classes that other districts salivate over. Many students leave our schools looking for careers in science, the medical, nursing, agriculture, engineering, and other technical fields, from our biomedical pathway to the greenhouse for sustainability to astronomy and science classes. Our District is a leader in the county for the diverse science course offerings students can take. I am proud to be a PUHSD employee but very proud to be a science teacher in the District." # ORAL REPORTS (cont.)

"I also wanted to speak tonight about the subject of grievances. I don't have any to file; I wanted to . impart ideas and perspectives on the idea of a grievance. Often, a member will come to us with a problem and immediately say, "I want to file a grievance." That is almost a common catchphrase with a lot of unions. However, the reality is that many problems are solved through various means, grievances only being one tool for solving very specific sets of problems. Grievances are very narrow in scope and limited to the language in our collective bargaining agreement. Some issues arise that are real issues. There may not necessarily be a grievance, but it may fall under alternate formats. Often, easy, simple mistakes are solved this way and may or may not have fallen under the area of a grievance. My favorite issue that may not necessarily be a grievance but may fall under alternate formats is simply a call or email to the District. Last week, there was a problem with a teacher's cell replacement. One quick email, and boom, the problem is solved in half an hour. No timelines, no haggling, no filing of paperwork, multiple sets of paperwork, just plain old problem-solving. The District has assured us that if there is a contract violation, they will fix it. That has indeed been the case, but we will not make up a contract violation where one does not exist. I remember years ago when all I knew was to throw a grievance on every problem and see what sticks. That is no way to live. Grievances can be time-consuming and effort-intensive. Is it a grievance for fixing a problem or for fighting? I say it is a way to solve a problem potentially. But I like to keep the idea of solving the problem at the forefront of that thinking. Don't get me wrong; if the grievance procedure needs to be used, we will use it. But PSEA is not chomping at the bit to file a grievance. PSEA wants solutions not to extract a pound of flesh. Thank you for this time to speak."

#### 9.6 Comments by the Board of Trustees

Trustee Araux thanked PSEA President Jason Miller for collaborating with the District and focusing on solutions. In addition, he congratulated teachers for Teacher Appreciation Week and classified staff for CSEA Appreciation Week. He thanked the student representatives for keeping the board informed during this school year and congratulated all the graduates.

Trustee Araux also requested an update on AP completion rates, high school graduation rates, AP completion students with college credits, English learners, foster youth, Hispanics, African Americans, and different subgroups. He had asked that an update be provided at the June board meeting. He also requested the status of the ethnic studies course that legislation approved to start in approximately two years.

Trustee Freeman stated that he's seen videos and has read about some of the things happening at school board meetings across the country and is grateful for such a wonderful group of parents and community that the District does not have to worry about that kind of action.

Trustee Vallejo congratulated the employees who received awards at the Employee Recognition. She stated that she is proud to be part of the District. She also thanked Josh Rushing and Jason Miller for attending board meetings and informing the board. Trustee Vallejo shared that she participated in the 5k run that the District hosted with the City of Perris. Lastly, she attended the Empower Your Mind Workshop, hosted by our District, the City of Perris, and Val Verde USD. It was an event for mental health awareness and offered helpful resources.

He echoed the other board members and thanked all the staff, teachers, classified staff, nutrition services, campus supervisors, and administration for doing an awesome job this year.
