CAMPUS SECURITY

The Superintendent or designee shall <u>develop aensure that the district's</u> campus security plan <u>which</u> <u>contributes to a positive school climate</u>, fosters social and emotional learning and student well-<u>being, and</u> includes strategies to:

1. Secure the campus perimeter and school facilities in order to prevent criminal activity

These strategies include a risk management analysis of each campus' security system, lighting system, and fencing. Procedures to ensure unobstructed views and eliminate blind spots caused by doorways and landscaping shall also be considered. In addition, parking lot design may be studied, including methods to discourage through traffic.

2. Secure buildings <u>and interior spaces</u> from outsiders and discourage trespassing

These strategies may include <u>installing locks</u>, requiring visitor registration, <u>providing</u> staff and student identification tags, and patrolling-of places used for congregating and loitering.

3. Discourage vandalism and graffiti

These strategies may include plans to immediately cover graffiti <u>and implementas</u> well as campus beautification projects and shall also include students and the community in these projects.

4. Control access to keys and other school inventory

These strategies may include creating the creation of a school watch program, increasing adult presence and supervision, establishing an anonymous crime reporting system, analyzing analysis of school crime incidents, and collaborating collaboration with local law enforcement agencies, including providing for law enforcement presence.

All staff shall receive training in building and grounds security procedures and emergency response.

Locks

All state-funded new construction and modernization projects shall include locks that allow doors to classrooms and any room with an occupancy of five or more persons to be locked from the inside. Student restrooms and doors that lock from the outside at all times are not required to have locks that can be locked from the inside. (Education Code 17075.50, 17583; 24 CCR 1010.1.9, 1010.1.11)

Keys

All keys used in a school shall be the responsibility of the principal or designee. Keys shall be issued only to <u>authorized</u> those employees who regularly need a key in order to carry out normal <u>activities of their job responsibilities</u>.position.

The principal or designee shall create a key control system with a record of each key assigned and room(s) or building(s) which the key opens.

Keys shall be used only by authorized employees and shall never be loaned to students, parents/guardians, or volunteers, nor shall the. The master key evershall not be loaned.

<u>Any</u>The person issued a key shall be responsible for its safekeeping. The duplication of school keys is prohibited. If a key is lost, the person responsible shall immediately report the loss to the principal or designee and shall pay for a replacement key.
