- Mr. Miller congratulated the PVHS football team on their win, in addition to Rachel Post and Danielle Anderson on receiving the RAVE Award.
- "The key is not in spending time but in investing it." What a powerful quote from Stephen L. Covey, and it is such a powerful driving force for our teachers and non-teaching educators. Our educators value their time, and time during the workday is precious to them. Most educators are on a rigid daily schedule with pacing and timing as one of the key components of their daily life. The more they can get done during the non-instructional part of their day, the more time they have outside of work for their own wellness and family. Generally, the cabinet has been sensitive to this, and we thank them because there has been quite a bit of planning time built into the school year for teachers without sacrificing "in-classroom time." There are so many different curriculums, educational fads, and various fanciful educational programs that teachers could implement in the classroom, but at the end of the day, they still need to prioritize their essential content areas balanced with classroom management. Their own classes are of high importance to the classroom teacher for the teacher's own sense of what needs to be taught right now. I hope to continue to see that the teachers are given some breathing room to have that time in the mornings, during the school day, and during the school year. We appreciate that there is time to work on curriculums, and we are thankful that this district continues to provide time for us. Thank you for the time to speak."
